

Upland Native Tree Planting Notice



These native trees [seen in the image] have been planted by Luggala Estate to restore upland native woodland cover on the estate.

Typically found along and adjacent to watercourses running into the hills, these woodlands provide a protective function, helping to slow the flow of water while providing valuable diversity of habitat and enhancing the landscape.

Native species of Common Birch, Rowan, Scots Pine, Sessile Oak, Willow, Holly and Aspen would typically be found. Remnant trees of all these species can be found in the existing upland landscape but they are unable to regenerate due to grazing pressures from deer and sheep. The fence and protective tubes are necessary to protect the young trees from these animals.
